Lesson Objectives:

- Acquiring the ability to organize accessible web pages and documents.
- Acquiring the ability to choose accessible web page titles.
- Acquiring the ability to use appropriate headings.
- Acquiring the ability to create proper links.
- Acquiring the ability to choose accessible colors and contrasts.

Pre-Class Activities:

Student Learning Resources at Home:

- Read:

- Check out webpage Accessibility Requirements for People with Low Vision.
- Try our different colors and contrasts and check it with contrast checker (e.g. <u>contrast</u> checker).

Student Learning Activities at Home:

• Go through all the resources that can be found on Moodle.

In-Class Activities:

0 – 20 minutes: <u>Page structure</u> – why is page structure important? Students work in groups. Each group should make a list of reasons and present it. Discussion (add if something is missing). **Moodle: exercise 1**

- **20 35 minutes**: Headings, paragraphs, structure: What have they learned at home? Discussion on headings and paragraphs.
- **35 50 minutes:** Students get a text which they should structure and add meaningful headings. Group work showing their examples and correcting them. Each group presents the best example from the group. **Moodle: exercise 2**
- **50 65 minutes:** Students work in groups. They should prepare guidelines on how to provide accessible layout when writing accessible content. They can use any resource from Moodle or internet. 5 topics we should get an answer on: Font type and size, Spacing, Color and contrast, Emphasizing (bold, italics, underline; capitalization), and Writing appropriate links. **Moodle: exercise 3**
- **65 80 minutes:** Students work individually on a document. They need to change the font (to be accessible), adjust the spacing, margins and borders, add accessible links. If they have any problems, they can help each other. **Moodle: exercise 4**

80 - 90 minutes: Summary.

Post-class Activities:

Short test (Name: Test 1), finalizing and uploading documents/answering the questions online.

Assessment:

- Upload all the exercises from the stationary workshops.
- Short online test.
